Please remember...




DRIVER SAFETY

- Do NOT wear solar eclipse glasses while driving
- Do NOT attempt to take pictures while driving
- DO pull over to a safe parking area for viewing with proper solar eclipse glasses







3 ways to safely view an eclipse

Foil window pinhole


The solar eclipse can be safely viewed by making a pinhole in a foil window, mounted on a cardboard shade.

Simply hold the shade so sunlight passes through it, and see the eclipse on the paper.

Pinhole projector

A pinhole projector can be made using a cardboard box. Create the foil window on one end, and place paper on the inside, opposite the pinhole side. The eclipse is seen on the paper.





Binocular magnification

To get a better view of the eclipse, use binoculars to magnify the image. Be sure not to look at the eclipse through the binoculars. Place a cardboard shade around one eypeiece, and with the binoculars mounted and pointed toward the sun, position the binoculars to project the image clearly onto a sheet of paper.

Solar Eclipse

- Arrive to your destination early
- Have a plan and supplies for unpredictable weather
- Be prepared for large crowds and limited parking
- Commit to one viewing area to avoid missing the Eclipse
- Wear proper Solar Eclipse viewing glasses for protection
- Leave later and give traffic a chance to clear out







If you miss the 2024 Total Solar Eclipse, your next opportunity will be on August 12, 2026. Unfortunately, you will need to travel to Greenland,

Iceland, Portugal, Russia, or Spain for that viewing.

To better suit the needs of our community, we have created a phone tree for the main line, 716-438-3171. All callers will be


given prompts to direct them to the appropriate person and/or resource to further assist them. In the event of a declared disaster, this new feature will allow us to provide information to the community.

With Daylight Savings time having just passed, it's the perfect time to check the batteries and the expiration date of your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.

DID YOU KNOW?

- -Smoke alarm and Carbon monoxide detector batteries should be changed twice a year. Using daylight savings time is a great way to remember when to do it.
- -Smoke alarms should be tested once a month to ensure they're working properly, and replaced if they aren't.
- -You should be replacing your alarms every 10 years.

Don't Wait — Check the Date!

Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years



Age matters when it comes to your smoke alarms.

Check the manufacture dates on your smoke alarms today!

Remove the smoke alarm from the wall or ceiling.





Look at the back of the alarm for the date of manufacture.

Smoke alarms should be replaced 10 years from the date of manufacture.





Put the alarm back on the ceiling or wall if it is less than 10 years old.



A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire.



Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

ACTIVE SHOOTER DRILL





No one likes the idea of performing an active shooter drill, but the unfortunate reality is the necessity for this training is increasing as active shooter situations are becoming more prevalent.

Recently, Wilson and Niagara Wheatfield schools took part in 2 complex active shooter drills. With teachers voluntarily playing the roles of victims, Niagara County was able to test their skills at responding to an active shooter situation. This was a joint effort drill that involved Niagara County EMS, Niagara County Sheriff, State Police, Border Patrol, Lewiston Police, and local fire departments.

The results of these drills can help unite law enforcement, fire and emergency services to be certain all responders are prepared to take action. Among many advantages of expediting an active shooter drill, some of the most important is finding our gaps and seeking ways to improve plans we currently have in place.
