A RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO WORK WITH THE LOCAL COMMUNITY TO ADDRESS THE CLOSING OF EASTERN NIAGARA HOSPITAL

WHEREAS, Eastern Niagara Hospital has announced that it will cease operation on June 17, 2023, and

WHEREAS, Catholic Health is in the process of constructing a new Emergency Room micro hospital, but that facility is not expected to be ready until the fall of this year, and

WHEREAS, that creates a serious lack of emergency medical care for thousands of residents in Eastern Niagara County, which has already been impacted by the reduction of medical facilities with the closure of Newfane Hospital several years ago and now the closing of ENH, and

WHEREAS, this closure will be right at the height of accidents and other injuries associated with summer activities and will require others seeking immediate medical care, like rape victims, to have to travel a significant distance for rape kits or wait hours for a SANE nurse to arrive at another hospital in western Niagara County, and

WHERERAS, while the Mayor of Lockport has convened stakeholder groups to work toward possible shortterm solution until the matter is addressed, the New York State Department of Health has not engaged in these conversations, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of Lockport sent a letter to Governor Hochul on March 17, 2023 requesting the state's help in identifying possible actions to deal to address this most pressing issue, and shockingly, has yet to receive any feedback or response to that letter, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature calls on Governor Hochul and the New York State Department of Health to join with other stakeholders in identifying potential solutions to the lack of emergency care in eastern Niagara County between the time Eastern Niagara Hospital closes and the new Catholic Health facility opens, and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Hochul, the New York State Department of Health and the Niagara County delegation to the New York State Legislature.
