




A total solar eclipse is when the Sun's disk is completely covered by the moon's shadow for a short period of time

2024 Total Solar Eclipse



- The total solar eclipse will occur on April 8, 2024.
- Niagara County is in the 120-mile path of totality
- The eclipse will begin about 2:07 p.m.
- Totality will begin around 3:18 p.m.
 - Where the Moon completely covers the sun in the sky
- Totality lasts about 3 min 32 seconds
- Partial Eclipse ends around 4:33 p.m.

2024 Total Solar Eclipse



- If weather is clear, it is not a question of <u>if</u> people will show up, but <u>how many</u>. Could be in the 100,000's+ in the region
- Eclipse-visitors often are not committed to view from any one location and will favor mobility, confirming their viewing plans the day before or even the day of the eclipse based on the weather forecast.
- There will be both sanctioned and unsanctioned events.
 - Sanctioned events those that have been recognized
 - Unsanctioned events site specific or (POP-UP).



A total solar eclipse is about as bright as the full Moon — and just as safe to look at. But the Sun at any other time is dangerously bright. View it only through special-purpose solar filters that comply with the transmission requirements of the ISO 12312-2 international standard for filters for direct viewing of the Sun.

Niagara County Weather



- Dress accordingly. On April 8, the temperature in Buffalo typically ranges from 38°F to 49°F and is rarely below 27°F or above 64°F.
- Lake Ontario and Niagara River water temperature potentially between 35° F to 40° F
- Historically in Buffalo on April 8, the percentage of time that the sky is overcast or mostly cloudy remaining about 56% throughout the day.





- The eclipse itself poses no risk to those who use solar eclipse glasses when viewing the eclipse when worn properly
- It is expected that large amounts of people will be travelling to Niagara County to view the eclipse. Great for the economy!
- During the 2017 solar eclipse:
 - Traffic jams in many local areas
 - Fuel shortages in small towns Fill your tank
 - Impacts to emergency response Responders are prepared





- This will be a **five** day event possibly April 5 9, 2024, many great events scheduled all across Niagara County
- Huge economic event for our community
- Visitors will trickle in over several days prior to the event
 - Prepare for your needs for the weekend and especially Monday
 - Medicine
 - Fuel
 - Food
- Many observers will travel without planned lodging.
- Many observers will attend eclipse related events as well.



- Visitors and Viewers will position themselves at any location they believe to be legal. Especially areas with long sight-lines:
 - Building roofs
 - Hilltops
 - Niagara Gorge
 - River & Lake Shorelines Boats on the water
 - Remote areas
 - State and local parks
 - Hiking trails and campsites
 - Farm land

Be prepared for viewers in areas they aren't supposed to be!

- A huge exodus of visitors may leave immediately at the end of totality or end of event and a significant number will wait until the following day.
 - If 2017 is a guide, most people will want to depart in the 2 hours post-totality traffic increased by 50%+ from regular traffic in areas in 2017
 - Majority leave right after the first 15 minutes post totality (this is the biggest issue!)

Transportation networks may see congestion including total stoppage
