Did you know?

- All sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are treatable; most are curable.
- Your yearly physical or gynecological exam may not routinely include STI or HIV testing.
- One in two sexually active young people will get an STI by the age of 25. Most will not know it.
- 80% of women and 50% of men have no symptoms.
- Untreated STIs can cause lifelong problems, such as: chronic abdominal (lower belly) pain, the inability to have children, harmful effects on pregnancy and newborn babies, arthritis, and could affect the heart or brain.
- Having an STI can increase your chance of getting HIV if exposed to the virus.

Who Should Get Tested?

- Anyone who has had any form of sexual activity with a person whose STI or HIV status you did not know.
- If you have ever shared any drug equipment and have never been tested before.
- Before starting a new sexual relationship, you and your partner should both be tested and treated, if necessary.

How to Help Prevent Infection

- Do not have sex with a partner if you have symptoms, or are with someone with symptoms.
- Limit your number of sex partners. Having only one sexual partner, who is uninfected and who only has sex with you, is the safest way to prevent infection.
- Wash genitals after sexual relations.
- Use a water-based lubricated latex or polyurethane condom with each sex act.
- Do not share drug equipment.
- Make sure you are up to date on all vaccines, especially the HPV vaccine for anyone 26 years and younger.

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) is a pill that can prevent HIV infection. It is for HIV negative people who are at risk of becoming HIV positive through sexual activity or from injecting drugs.
